Paso Del Sol, Sauvignon Blanc, Chile, 2009 Classic New World Sauvignon Blanc with a powerful aromatic nose. Cut grass, ripe gooseberry and grapefruit flavours.	3.95	5.60	16.25
Keate's Drift, Chenin Blanc, South Africa, 2009 Pale straw like in colour, with a clean fresh finish and faint taste of honeycomb on the tongue. Produced from mature bush vines, this is a superb example of a Chenin Blanc from the Franschoek region of the Cape.	4.30	5.95	17.50
El Coto Bianco, Rioja, Spain, 2008 Pale, clear with greenish hues, intensely aromatic, well balanced with body and a refreshing touch of tartness. Pleasantly acidic with an exquisite aftertaste of flowers, fruit and fine herbs.	4.40	6.10	17.70

Mission Estate, Riesling, Marlborough, New Zealand, 2008 A bright and clean Riesling with good fruit definition and great acidity. The nose has an intense lime and floral aroma, the palate is fresh and long with a soft fruit finish.			25.50
Mitchell Riesling, Watervale, Southern Australia, 2005 This wine should dispel any misunderstanding as to how gorgeous Riesling can be. This is subtly dry. It is perfumed, complex, fragrant and charming on the nose, and the palate delivers a fresh, aromatic and exotic flavour with a marvellous powerful tangy character.			26.95
Viognier, Vins de Pays des Côtes de Thongue, France, 2007 Highly perfumed wine, which is sweet and rich. The aroma is of peaches or apricots and the flavour can remind you of stone fruit kernels. The mouth feel is very rich and aromatic with a long lasting finish.			26.95
Churton, Sauvignon Blanc, Marlborough, New Zealand, 2007 A beautiful Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc, cultivated with care from a small private vineyard. This has a lovely, crisp citrus freshness and zing. Aromas of freshly mown grass are followed by gooseberry fruit with hints of dry, white peach. Easily our favourite Sauvignon Blanc, stylish and brilliant.			27.00
St Veran, Les Pierres Blanches, Burgundy, France, 2006 Dry classic white Burgundy from the Mâconnais district. Full of ripe Chardonnay fruit but tempered by a steely mineral quality, resulting in a fine, elegant wine. A competent understudy to Pouilly Fuissé.			29.95

Pinot Blanc, Hugel, Alsace, France, 2005				29.95
Hugel is one of the finest producers in Alsace. The Pinot Blanc is smooth, dry and elegant with a floral bouquet and hints of elderflower. Lovely as an aperitif on a summer's evening.				
Chardonnay Les Chênes Vieilles Vignes, Burgundy, France, 2007				29.95
Produced from vines with an average age of 25 years this is a deep and concentrated wine from an outstanding producer. It is briefly aged in oak to add toasty notes to the buttery fruit and is a fine well-balanced white Burgundy.				
Jean Marc Brocard, Chablis, Burgundy, France, 2007				35.95
The king of Chardonnay from the heart of Burgundy, dry and pure. This world-famous white wine exudes class and style, more acidic than New World Chardonnays but with great elegance, subtle lemony fruit and flinty, mineral flavours.				
Les Moulins à Vent, Pouilly Fume, Loire, France, 2007				35.95
This classic Loire Sauvignon Blanc acquires the term 'fume' from the distinctive gunflint aromas of the wine. On the palate it is crisp with fresh fruit flavours notably gooseberry and grapefruit.

A blend of Grenache, Syrah and Carignan, this Silver Medal winning Côtes du Rhône is produced from exclusive Vineyards in the Southern Rhône Valley. Well balanced, with delicious black fruits and just a perfect amount of spice				
Alta Vista Classic, Malbec, Argentina, 2008	4.75	6.75	19.95	
Bright violet-red colour. This wine has an intense nose, with aromas of red fruit particularly plums, and with vanilla notes and subtle coffee touches resulting from its storage in oak. On the palate one finds a freshness and soft, rounded tannins.				
El Coto Crianza, Rioja, Spain, 2006	5.65	8.05	23.95	
Medium-bodied with soft, succulent raspberry fruit and subtle spicy flavours. Ageing in American oak for 12 months adds creamy and vanilla characteristics to this sensuous wine. Dangerously moreish.				
You, Me and the Gatepost, Shiraz, Western Australia, 2008				24.00
A succulent and spicy red with real depth of flavour and a kiss of oak. This wine shows the superb quality that Western Australia is now producing				
Château du Chatelard, Beaujolais, France, 2008				24.95
Made from the Gamay grape, this is an attractive, cherry-coloured wine with a bouquet of strawberries and blackcurrants. It has a smooth, well-balanced flavour, very light and refreshing.				
Valpolicella Superiore, Vigne Nuove di Musella, Italy, 2006				25.95
A blend of Corvina, Molinara and Rondinella grapes, this is a seductive plump-fruited wine of bitter cherries, raisins, chocolate and vanilla. It is a mature wine with great depth. Try it chilled, a Ship favourite, if you see an open bottle, Osh is likely to be found nearby.				
Chateau Cluzan, Bordeaux, France, 2007				25.95
A charming Claret, made from a blend of 60% Merlot, 29% Cabernet Sauvignon and 11% Cabernet Franc. Well-balanced with plenty of soft blackcurrant and plummy fruit with hints of cedar and leather on the finish.				
Mission Estate, Syrah, Hawkes Bay, New Zealand, 2007				26.50
A new world wine produced in an old world style. The medium bodied Syrah denotes characteristics of a classic northern Rhone. Spicy aromas and good fruit intensity make way for a more elegant, tannic and smoke flavoured finish.				

Mission Estate, Reserve Pino Noir, Central Otago, New Zealand	29.00
This Pino Noir is deep garnet in colour and has a nose dominated by dark cherry and violets. The palate is packed with rich red and berry fruit. A brilliant Pino Noir from New Zealand's most respected vineyard	
Coto de Imaz, Reserva, Rioja, Spain, 2004	29.95
Made from 100% Tempranillo which gives the wine a deep ruby colour and a complex nose of dark fruit. There are traces of mocha cream, caramel and spices with a round velvety finish.	
Altum, Cabernet Sauvignon, Chile, 2006	35.00
A great rich and full bodied red from Chile. Deep black/ red colour with elegant berries on the nose. Vanilla and smokey new oak aromas. Full flavoursome initial palate, with smooth finish and a firm grip.	
Ad Astra, Nittardi, Toscana, Italy, 2005	34.95
Ad Astra is a unique and individual wine made from Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Syrah grapes with a hint of Sangiovese. It is grown in the coastal 'Maremma' region of Tuscany on the hills of Mongibello. It's medium-bodied with red berries and plums, hints of liquorice and cedar on the finish. A remarkable wine and we love it, well-worth trying.	
Museum Real, Cigales, Spain, 2003	33.95
Rich, concentrated and ripe berry fruit flavours combine with a heady mixture of chocolate, liquorice and spice to make this exceptional Spanish red.	
Alta Vista, Malbec Grande Reserve, Argentina, 2006	34.50
With an intense red colour and purple-blue tints, this Malbec presents complex aromas of black fruit followed by hints of vanilla. It is rich and ample in the mouth with soft tannins.	
Casanova di Nittardi, Chianti Classico, Tuscany, Italy 2006	35.00
Winner of the Wine Spectator, Winemaker of the Year 2009. This incredible achievement is reflected in the quality of this superb Chianti. Clean, ripe red fruits with blackberry and a hint of liquorice. Delicious	
Gigondas Domaine Raspail-Ay, Cru des Côtes du Rhône, France, 2006	38.00
Youthful appearance with an inky core, this is a very expressive style with gently sweet blackberry fruit on the nose and palate. Discreet notes of herb and spice are discernible, but it is the fine and admirably pure mouth-filling dark fruit that takes centre stage.	
Churton, Pinot Noir, Marlborough, New Zealand, 2007	35.50
Gem of a hand picked Pinot Noir from a small private vineyard. Ruby red wine that exhibits black cherry, earth, raspberry and spiced characteristics. Complex palate with soft, fine-grained tannins. Fantastic.	
Cote de Beaune Villages, Joseph Drouhin, France, 2005	39.95
A charming sensuous nose of sweet ripe wild strawberries and raspberries followed by typical rich Noir fruit with a luscious lingering finish.
