La Val Albariño, Rias Baixas, 2007, Spain A wonderfully fragrant wine from north-west Spain using the local Albariño grape. A slight spritz on the tongue characterizes this dry white and ensures its freshness. On the palate it is very elegant and delicate with hints of peaches, apricots and limes.			28.95
Churton Sauvignon Blanc Marlborough, 2007, New Zealand A beautiful Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc, cultivated with care from a small private vineyard. This has a lovely, crisp citrus freshness and zing. Aromas of freshly mown grass are followed by gooseberry fruit with hints of dry, white peach. Easily our favourite Sauvignon Blanc, stylish and brilliant.			26.50
St Veran, Les Pierres Blanches, Burgundy, 2006, France Dry classic white Burgundy from the Mâconnais. Full of ripe Chardonnay fruit but tempered by a steely mineral quality, resulting in a fine, elegant wine. A competent understudy to Pouilly Fuissé.			29.95
Pinot Blanc Alsace Hugel, 2005, France Hugel is one of the finest producers in Alsace. The Pinot Blanc is smooth, dry and elegant with a floral bouquet and hints of elderflower. Lovely as an aperitif on a summer’s evening.			29.95

Mitchell Grenache Sangiovese-Mourvedre, 2002, Western Australia This wine is made from hand picked grapes from some of the oldest vines in the world. Coto de Imaz, Rioja, 2004, Spain Made from 100% Tempranillo which gives the wine a deep ruby colour and a complex nose of dark fruit. There are traces of mocha cream, caramel and spices with a round velvety finish.			29.95
Altum, Cabernet Sauvignon, 2005, Chile A great rich and full bodied red from Chile. Deep black red colour with elegant berries on the nose. Vanilla and smokey new oak aromas. Full flavoursome initial palate, with smooth finish and a firm grip			34.95
Ad Astra, Nittardi, Toscana, 2005, Italy Ad Astra is a unique and individual wine made from Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Syrah grapes with a hint of Sangiovese. It is grown in the coastal ‘Maremma’ region of Tuscany on the hills of Mongibello. It’s medium-bodied with red berries and plums, hints of liquorice and cedar on the finish. Museum Real, 2003, Cigales, Spain Rich, concentrated and ripe berry fruit flavours combine with a heady mixture of chocolate, liquorice and spice to make this exceptional Spanish red.			33.95
Alta Vista Malbec Grande Reserve, 2005, Argentina With an intense red colour and purple-blue tints, this Malbec presents complex aromas of black fruit followed by hints of vanilla. It is rich and ample in the mouth with soft tannins.			34.50
Mercrey Domaine de Suremain, 2004, Burgundy France Silky soft Pinot Noir. Summer fruits, hints of pepper with earthy notes and a gentle touch of oak.			38.50
Churton Pinot Noir Marlborough, 2006, New Zealand Gem of a hand picked Pinot Noir from a small private vineyard. Ruby red wine that exhibits black cherry, earth, raspberry and spiced characteristics. Complex palate with soft, fine-grained tannins. Fantastic.			35.50
Cote de Beaune Villages, Joseph Drouhin, 2005, France A charming sensuous nose of sweet ripe wild strawberries and raspberries followed by typical rich Pinot Noir fruit with a luscious lingering finish.			39.95
Chateau Batailley Grand Cru Classe Pauillac, 1999, France This famous Château exhibits a beautiful, brilliant dark red colour and an attractive vanilla nose. On the palate it is full-bodied Bordeaux with a round texture and an excellent long finish.			46.50
Volnay Boillot Burgundy, 2002, France A classic Pinot Noir with focused red fruit profile that is laced with some earthy truffle and a hint of spice on the finish. The wines of Lucien Boillot et Fils are not the type to take a back seat. They have been variously described as "meaty", "substantial", "tannic", "robust", "spicy" and "austere". People talk of them having a big presence on the palate.			58.40
Chateauneuf Du Pape Domaine Font De Michelle, 2006, Rhône, France This classic southern Rhône blend includes Grenache Noir, Syrah and Mourvèdre. It is deep and lively, garnet in colour. This superb wine has complex and intensive aromas, predominantly blackcurrants but also notes of leather, truffles and spices. Really impressive.			48.50
Chateau D’Angludet Margaux, 2002, France Owned by the Sichel family since 1961, Angludet is situated in the heart of the Margaux appellation and enjoys a worldwide reputation for elegance, finesse, and longevity. Probably the most delicate of all of the Bordeaux wines.			53.95
Chateau Langoa Barton St Julien Bordeaux, 1996, France Langoa’s 1996 vintage is superb, with expressive notes of sweet plum, red berry and bramble fruit on the nose and a creamy vanilla character. There is lovely concentration here with balancing tannins and fresh acidity.			73.50
Barolo, Brezza, 2001, Italy Made from the Nebbiolo grape variety in Piedmont. This is an intensely heady, seductive wine with a surprisingly elegant nose of rosewater and almonds. The wine of kings, it is backed by bold tannins yet intense tarry fruit and hints of ripe cherries. Powerful and persistent.			52.50
Chateau Rauzan Segla Margaux Bordeaux, 1996, France There is lovely character on the nose here, which exhibits aromas of dark, slightly floral, rather nutty fruit. The palate demonstrates a fine, elegant balance, with a seamless finesse. It is quite fluid and has wonderful style. This wine pleases with a creamy presence and close to perfect structure. If we could afford it, we would all have a glass every day.			83.50
